SNRC offers courses that help students clear the JLPT. Duration of course is different for different levels. As one clears the lower levels the student's overall proficiency in Japanese, i.e. speaking, listening, reading and writing, is improved.

N5: 80 hours for completion, entry level understanding of Japanese, the basics of the language are taught (online classes are available).

N4: 90 hours for completion, intermediate understanding of Japanese, higher understanding of grammar and conversational skills (online classes are available).

N3: 120 hours for completion, language proficiency is increased to a level where Japanese can be used in most everyday situations (online classes are available).

N2: 150 hours for completion, advanced understanding of the language, enables proficient everyday use of Japanese, this level grants a higher command over language skills.

The JLPT follows a prescribed syllabus and is recognised by the Japan Foundation, one of the primary international institutions of cultural exchange with Japan and the world. Besides the JLPT test training, Sakura Nihongo also offers two "Learn Japanese" courses for students wishing to learn only conversational skills in Japanese:

Learn Japanese – Basic Conversation Programme: takes 20 hours for completion, beginner's level, no prior knowledge is required for this level.

Learn Japanese – Advanced Conversation Programme: takes 30 hours for completion, students with modest Japanese language skills can opt for this option.



## INTERPRETATION & TRANSLATION

- For persons who speak the Japanese language, translation and interpretation are two of the most well-known job options.
- You must understand that translation is not the same as interpretation. That's correct!
- Working as a translator entails "taking items written in Japanese and converting them to English" and vice versa.
- Working as an interpreter, on the other hand, will act as a bridge between two speakers of different languages.
- Both of you must be able to communicate in both languages to each of the persons concerned.
- These services are required by a large number of private and public sector businesses.
- While you may be hired as a translator, the job requires you to operate as both a translator and an interpreter.

## TEACHING OR TRAINER IN JAPANESE

- When it comes to learning another man's language, the Japanese are incredibly bashful. It's one of the reasons why the majority of Indian companies are looking for trainers.
- As a Japanese language speaker in India, you can apply to work as a trainer for any Japanese organization, where you will be able to teach potential applicants a fantastic opportunity.
- Perhaps you could assist them in training their employees on how to interact with clients and enterprises of a different sort.
- Again, there are several work prospects in the educational sector for language teachers who want to add value by teaching Japanese.
- You will also help to strengthen your language skills and encourage future generations of Japanese speakers if you pursue a teaching career.
- In India, there are many opportunities for Japanese teachers in schools, colleges, institutes, and corporate buildings/offices.



## EMBASSIES AND GOVERNMENT OFFICE JOBS

- Japanese language experts are needed by Indian government agencies such as the External Affairs Ministry, Indian embassies abroad, the Ministry of Tourism, and other ministries such as Education, Commerce, Science & Technology, Agriculture, and Textile.
- Despite the fact that the number of openings is restricted, if you are not a government employee, you will be able to get work with these government institutions.
- When we say “Language Jobs in Embassies,” we’re referring to support staff or officers assigned to embassies or consulates in India or overseas.
- You could also work at the Japanese embassy in India as a staff member.
- Because most Japanese rarely learn another man’s language, the second possibility is quite likely.
- Diplomats who speak Japanese work at embassies and consulates all around Japan, so be prepared to relocate.

## INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SECTOR

- The bulk of Japanese multinational corporations (MNCs) and their Indian counterparts doing business in the country and abroad prefer candidates with technical capabilities and a strong command of the Japanese language.
- The majority of their consumers and clients are Japanese.
- As a result, having a Japanese-speaking system administrator, data manager, developer, programmer, system analyst, and so on is a good idea. Also, he is aware of the importance of a strong work ethic.
- If you have these technical talents, being able to communicate in Japanese will help you land a job.

## WORK IN THE HOSPITALITY INDUSTRY OR AS A TOUR GUIDE

- Let’s say you’re looking for a job that combines languages and travel. In such a scenario, a career in the travel, tourism, leisure, or hospitality industries is an excellent choice.
- The hospitality sector is a vast field in which you can find work in a variety of settings, including events, restaurants, travel firms, hotels, and many more.
- You could even go it alone and work as a tour guide.



- As previously said, export drives the Japanese economy, and India is a key destination for Japanese goods and services.
- As a result, the number of Japanese tourists visiting India each year has been steadily increasing.
- You can work as a tour guide for Japanese tourists or a group of visiting students or researchers who are visiting India for one or more reasons.
- On the other hand, you can work as a tour guide or consultant for Indian students or groups visiting Japan for a variety of reasons.

## Aviation Industry Jobs and Flight Attendants

- A bachelor's degree is all that is required for this position. You can apply for this job by emphasizing your Japanese skills as well as your English or native language proficiency.
- Working as an international flight attendant may be both enjoyable and rewarding.
- It will also motivate you to improve your Japanese language skills in the area of customer service.
- You may also have a better chance of being promoted.

## IN THE EXPORT-IMPORT INDUSTRY, A SALES REPRESENTATIVE

- Because the Japanese economy is based on exports, most businesses rely on salespeople or service agents.
- It assists with communication with international clients, data entering, telephone responding, advancing the company's goals, and other administrative activities.
- You can work as a sales representative in India using your Japanese language skills (together with your major qualifications, such as an MBA in marketing).
- Alternatively, on behalf of Japanese firms and clients, between India and Japan. The number of work opportunities in the import and export market is virtually limitless!

## GET A JOB IN A JAPANESE COMPANY

- Japanese multinational corporations have operations in India. You might be able to work for one of these businesses.



- According to the Japanese Embassy and JETRO, there are 1,441 Japanese companies registered in India. As of October 2018, there were 5,102 Japanese businesses.
- You can work for Japanese multinational corporations such as Toshiba, Honda, Suzuki, Sony, Toyota, Canon, Yamaha, Panasonic, Mitsubishi, Casio, Daikin, Fujitsu, etc., depending on your key abilities.
- The role available will also differ depending on the company.
- The good news is that after you acquire the primary qualifications required for such positions, you can move on to the next step.
- For example, for varied assignments, an engineering degree, an MSc in IT or an MBA in finance, or a simple graduate.
- Your fluency in the Japanese language will put you miles ahead of those who do not speak yet have superior qualifications.
- You can also work with organizations in the automotive, engineering, information, and technology, animation, or gaming industries that have a business tie with Japanese MNCs.

## VOICE COORDINATION/OUTBOUND PROCESS

- Some BPOs in India work with Japanese clients. As a result, they are continuously on the lookout for someone who can assist them with their language needs.
- Your ability to communicate in the Japanese language may lead to employment in BPO and KPO. It also pays well, and there are other benefits that come with a job like this.
- Voice coordinator is one of the tasks you can give to firms in need of voice assistance services.
- You'll be assisting in the expansion of language assistance and effective communication outreach in BPOs and teleconferences.

## DOING BUSINESS IN JAPAN

- Learning the Japanese language in India can undoubtedly help you advance in your job.
- Once you have achieved an advanced level of Japanese, you will be able to travel and work in Japan.
- Many organizations in Japan are eager to hire someone who is proficient in both Japanese and English, as well as the other abilities required for the position.
